

Why Do We Sing?--Samantha Millard

The importance of music in biblical religion is shown very simply by the fact that the verb "to sing" (with related words such as "song", and so forth) is one of the most commonly used words in the Bible. It occurs 309 times in the Old Testament and thirty-six in the New.

Pope Benedict XVI

The first reference to singing in the Bible comes as the children of Israel were led by Moses out of slavery in the crossing of the Red Sea. They were delivered to safety from the Egyptian army that pursued them and they celebrated that moment with singing. The text of that song found in Exodus 15 is commonly called the Song of Moses and we sing it each year as part of our Easter Vigil celebration. In the General Instruction of the Roman Missal we are told, "The Christian faithful who come together as one in expectation of the Lord's coming are instructed by the Apostle Paul to sing together the Psalms, hymns, and spiritual canticles (cf. Colossians 3:16). Singing is the sign of the heart's joy (cf. Acts 2:46). Thus St. Augustine says rightly, "Singing is for one who loves," and there is also an ancient proverb: "Whoever sings well prays twice over."

Singing is an essential part of our liturgy and heritage as Catholics. It helps to bring us together as one body in our worship of God. It can help us to prepare our hearts and minds to receive Christ in the Eucharist. It gives us a means to show our gratitude for all that our Lord has done for us. The music ministry at St. Mary of the Springs takes very seriously our role in leading the musical part of our worship and we are grateful for the opportunity to serve you.

Saint of the Week St. Marianna Cope, Virgin

In 1838, Barbara Koob (Cope) was born in Germany, and her family immigrated to Utica, New York in 1839. She joined the Sisters of

St. Francis in Syracuse New York in 1862, and became Sister Marianna in November, 1862. She soon became teaching throughout New York state, but God had a larger plan in mind for her.

In the 1860s, she helped establish two of the first hospitals in central New York state. By the 1880s, she was the Provincial Mother in Syracuse. In 1883, her order was asked if they could help mange hospitals and schools in the Hawaiian Islands, and help with leprosy patients. She and six other sisters arrived in Honolulu in November, 1883. They took charge of the Kaka'ako Branch Hospital in Oahu, and several years later they added the Kapi'olani Home on the grounds to safely care for the healthy daughters of leprosy patients.

She grew to know Blessed Father Damien in the last years of his life. When the United States annexed the Hawaiian Islands, and closed the hospital in Oahu, she and several sisters began working in the leper settlement on Molokai. She ran Fr. Damian's Boy's Home after he passed until a new priest could be sent.

Despite the grim conditions she worked in, Sr. Marianna lived to be eighty years old. She died of natural causes in 1918, and was buried in Hawaii. She was canonized in 2012 by Pope Benedict XVI. She is the patron saint of Hawaii, lepers, outcasts, and people suffering from HIV.

Her feast day is January 23.


