When Do We Use Chant?--Samantha Millard

Last month in my bulletin article, I addressed the question, "Why do Catholics Chant?" This month I'd like to expand on that topic and look at how we implement chant at St. Mary of the Springs. As we learned last month, chant has been the music of the Church for 2,000 years and church documents still tell us that it should be given "pride of place" in our liturgies. It is a beautiful way to sing and pray at the same time.

Two of the places we use chant year-round come during the Liturgy of the Word. After the first reading, we chant the Responsorial Psalm. The cantor first sings the response, which the congregation then repeats. Then the verses of the Psalm are chanted by the cantor or choir, with the congregational response being sung after each verse. Then after the second reading, we have the Gospel Acclamation chant which begins with an Alleluia or Praise to You, Lord Jesus Christ, introduced by the cantor and echoed by the congregation, followed by a gospel sentence, and concludes as it was begun.

In the past few months we have added two more chants to our mass taken from the mass propers. We are chanting the Entrance Antiphon for the day along with psalm verses as a prelude to Mass. This is a nice time to quiet your heart and prayerfully prepare yourself for Mass to begin as the Scripture is sung. The second one comes during Communion. We are chanting the Communion Antiphon from the propers of the day, again, to provide a quiet background to your prayers and reflection on the Eucharist.

And then this past week, as we entered the penitential season of Lent, we set aside our usual Heritage Mass setting and began using the Latin Chant Mass setting. We make this change every Lent and Advent to set apart those seasons in our year and to hopefully draw us into deeper reflection and prayer as we approach the feasts of Easter and Christmas.

As always, we pray that the music here at St. Mary's draws you more deeply into worship and gives you an opportunity to pray and to praise our Lord.

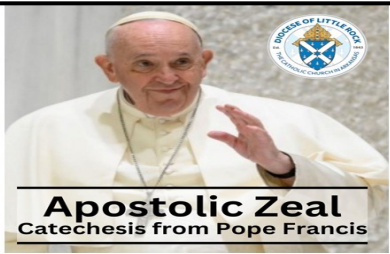

St. Patrick--March 17th

The man who would become known as St. Patrick was born around 387 A.E., in the Roman-controlled British Isles (Wales, Scotland, and Britain all claim this distinction), into a wealthy Christianized family. His father was a deacon in the church, and his grandfather was a married priest. Still, as a young man, Patrick had little interest in developing his faith, and focused his attention on worldly matters.

When he was in his mid-teens, this all changed for him. A

Gaelic raiding party from Ireland attacked his village seeking loot and slaves. Patrick was among the many souls captured and taken to the pagan island. They quickly found themselves in a country that practiced a mix of polytheism and animism (nature worship) overseen by druidic priests. He was sold and put to work as a swine herder, managing alone in the wilds. As he survived, Patrick's heart softened and turned toward God. He became convinced that God permitted the raid to happen because he and the others had abandoned their religious duties, and deserved punishment.

Over his captivity, Patrick faithfully developed his relationship with God and a strong prayer life. After six years he escaped back to England, and was reunited with his family. Patrick always cited divine intervention in his escape, saying that God directed each step of his journey. Home again, he devoted himself to prayer and study, eventually becoming a priest. Throughout this time, he had many visions and dreams in which the souls of Ireland called out for him to return and help them. His family opposed the idea, but he was determined to return as a missionary.

Because he was already familiar with the culture and the language, Patrick was an ideal candidate. Eventually becoming a Bishop, he was sent back to Ireland to begin his conversion work. Ireland at the time was divided into clans which joined together to form small kingdoms. Over the years of his work, Patrick converted one kingdom at a time, enduring at least one bout of captivity, constant dangers, and intense opposition from the powerful druid class. Despite it all, he converted thousands of souls, built churches, established religious communities, and crushed the pagan control of the island. He passed away in Ireland somewhere in the mid-400s, and was buried on the island that he devoted so much of his life too.

St. Patrick has never been officially canonized by a pope. He is considered a Pre-Congregation Saint—one accepted on tradition rather than through the official process. Many myths and legends surround his life, these stories making him one of the most famous saints in the world. His Patronages include the countries of Ireland, Nigeria and Montserrat, the Australian Archdiocese of Melbourne, the American Archdioceses of New York, Los Angeles, Boston, and the cities of Loiza in Puerto Rico and Murcia in Spain. He is the patron saint of engineers, and paralegals, and he is invoked against snakes and snake bites.

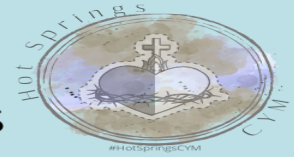
